

Two-day National Workshop on Urban Flood Mitigation to Strengthen Risk Resilience

A two day National Workshop on Urban Flood Mitigation – "Lessons learnt and Roadmap for future" was organised in Delhi by the National Disaster Management Authority, Government of India on 12th and 13th February 2016.

The workshop was inaugurated on 12th by Shri S. K. Srivastava, Secretary (Coordination), Cabinet Secretariat. The overall objective of the workshop was to carve out a roadmap towards effective mitigation and management of urban floods in the country. The NDMA Twitter Handle @ndmaindia was launched in partnership with Twitter India during the inaugural ceremony. The two day workshop recommended for preparation of Flood Hazard Risk Vulnerability Atlas, master plan for flood zonation based on natural hydrological features, development of real-time rainfall /cyclone monitoring & flood forecasting system including SOPs, integration synergised of hvdrometeorological data observation network and capacity building for preparedness and response especially at the community level.

The report presents the disaster trends in 2015 linked to natural hazards. According to the analysis, there were 346 reported disasters in 2015, 22,773 people dead, 98.6 million people were affected by those disasters and US\$66.5 billion of economic damages. Are Small Businesses Prepared for Natural Disasters

Alibaba, Vendio and Auctiva surveyed 600 small business owners in December 2012 to gauge how prepared they were to run their business if a natural disaster struck. The findings showed 74% of American small businesses do not have a disaster preparedness plan, 84% of them do not have any natural disaster insurance. More than one third don't know how quickly they can get back on their feet after a natural disaster. Interestingly, 62% of respondents said they could run their business from a mobile device and 30% of them store their business information in the cloud. Phone motion sensors detect tremors and pass on data in real time: US researchers have developed an app that uses networks of smartphones to detect earthquakes and could send out life-saving alerts. The free app, called <u>MyShake</u> and released on 12 February for Android users, could be useful in countries without conventional warning systems, say the developers at the University of California, Berkeley. <u>Click here</u> for complete news article.

Timely flood warnings for downstream Nepal and India. The ICIMOD has developed a new community based flood warning system that allows communities on the river banks to access real time information about the water level upstream to prepare for timely evacuation to safer areas. The benefits is already visible in about 45 villages residing on the rivers banks of Jiadhal and Singora rivers in India. (Source: Sci Dev Net). Flood Mapping in Odisha to Reduce Risk Factors: The coastal district of Kendrapara witnessed severe floods 12 times from 1994 to 2013. Loss of life and property was enormous. To avert such huge losses like in 2011 when 473 villages under nine blocks were badly hit, the Odisha State Disaster Mitigation Authority (OSDMA) released a Flood Inundation Mapping (FIM) for Kendrapara. The mapping has been prepared under Government of India-UNDP project on Enhancing Institutional and Community Resilience to Disaster and Climate Change-2013-17.
