#### Parliament passes Criminal Amendment Laws Bill 2013

Both Houses of Parliament approved the <u>Criminal Amendment Laws Bill 2013</u> which provides for stringent punishment to offenders of sexual violence. The bill, for the first time, provides for death penalty in rape cases, where the victim is left in a permanent vegetative state and also for repeat offenders. The bill, also makes it mandatory for hospitals, government or private, to provide first-aid and free-of-cost treatment for victims of sexual assault and acid attacks. While welcoming the bill, women's and progressive groups have raised concerns for raising the age of consent from 16 to 18 and not penalizing marital rape.

#### The Electronic Delivery of Services Bill

The Bill aims to provide access to all central and state government services electronically. The passage of this bill will provide access to all central and state government services, such as passport, ration card and driving licenses electronically within eight years. #### Expert Committee on Leveraging Panchayati Raj

The Ministry of Panchayati Raj established a six member expert committee to examine how panchayats can be leveraged for more efficient delivery of public goods and services under the chairmanship of Shri. Mani Shankar Aiyar. The terms of reference of the panel include reviewing the existing policy and guidelines of relevant Central sector/Centrally-sponsored schemes dealing with social sector/anti-poverty programmes, and give specific recommendations for the role and responsibility of panchayats, strengthening their capacity to deliver services and making them accountable to gram sabhas. The Committee is set to submit its report in a month's time. #### Rajiv Gandhi Panchayat Sashaktikaran Abhiyan (RGPSA)

The Ministry of Panchayati Raj (MoPR) launched the Rajiv Gandhi Panchayat Sashaktikaran Abhiyan with an objective to strengthen the Panchayati Raj system across the country and address critical gaps that constrain it. RGPSA seeks to enhance and strengthen capacities and create Panchayats and the Gram Sabhas to promote effectiveness, participation, transparency and accountability. #### "Good Rural Governance and Citizen Participation", 1<sup>st</sup> - 2<sup>nd</sup> March, IRRAD Gurgaon

Institute of Rural Research and Development (IRRAD) organized a two day conference on Good Rural Governance and Citizen Participation on the theme of Accountability at Grassroots- Experiences and Learning". The conference aimed to promote engagement among different stakeholders for strengthening policies on accountability at grassroots. The first day of the conference practitioners working on accountability mechanisms at the grassroots made presentations. These mechanisms included initiatives to make public institutions accountable like Right to Public Services Act, Social Audit in MNREGA and other ways to strengthen accountability and grievance redressal.

# National Seminar on 'Development Experience of Kerala in a Comparative Perspective', 16<sup>th</sup> March, India International Centre, New Delhi

Kerala Development Society (KDS) in the National Seminar, highlighted the good practices successful in furthering the development of Kerala, while at the same time pointed to increasing environment degradation, urban waste, alcoholism, unemployment for skilled labour as problems gripping the state. At the conference, KDS announced the launch of a <u>Database of Network of Resource Persons for Local</u> <u>Government (NRLG)</u> in facilitating inputs for Ministry of Panchayati Raj from those working in the field of PRIs.

#### National Consultation on Community Forest Rights, 16<sup>th</sup>-17<sup>th</sup> March 2013, New Delhi

Vasundhara and Kalpavriksh, in collaboration with Oxfam, organized this consultation as part of the Community Forest Rights (CFR) Learning and Advocacy Process initiated since December 2011. Participants included civil society organizations engaged in CFR analysis, implementation and conservation, independent researchers, community representatives and officials from MoTA. Participants from various states shared experiences in implementation and key issues (both at the level of policy and implementation) that are obstructing effective implementation of the CFR provision; follow up actions for the next year were decided. The key concerns and recommendations were shared with Secretary, MoTA Ms. Vibha Puri Das.

## Planning Commission hosts Google+ hang out, 15<sup>th</sup> March 2013, 5 PM

The Planning Commission, along with the National Innovation Council hosted an hour long session to discuss the draft 12<sup>th</sup> FYP and seek public opinion. News anchor Vikram Chandra moderated the interaction, taking questions from the Twitter followers of the plan panel. Participants included Planning Commission deputy chairman Montek Singh Ahluwalia, planning minister Rajeev Shukla, members and the secretary of the plan panel along with Sam Pitroda, chairman of the National Innovation Council. Invitees to the event were chairman and managing director of Bangalore-based biotechnology company Biocon, Kiran Mazumdar-Shaw; the *sarpanch* of Kanpura village in Rajasthan's Ajmer district, Jagdish Bairwa; Orissa MP Baijayant Jay Panda; and executive director of the National Foundation for India, Amitabh Behar. The Hangout saw more than 800 participants who welcomed the initiative, while demanding better accountability and policy proposals for different sectors in the 12th plan period.
