Sansad Adarsh Gram Yojana: All 750 MPs to be at scheme launch

"Sansad Adarsh Gram Yojana" is going to be launched on October 11, 2014 on the birth anniversary of Jai Prakash Narayan. Under this, each Member of Parliament (MP) will adopt a village every year for all-round development using the programmes of the Centre and States, aided by his constituency development funds (MPLADS).

MNREGA needed only in tribal, backward areas

NDA Government has indicated that it is contemplating to restrict the UPA's flagship social sector scheme MNREGA only to the tribal and backward districts and withdraw it from the States enjoying higher per capita income in the country. Guaranteeing up to 100 days of unskilled work in a year to every rural household, is not required in areas having high per capita income, higher growth rate and higher agricultural growth rate. As per Government's latest survey, Delhi, Goa, Andhra Pradesh, Gujarat, Haryana, Karnataka, Kerala, Maharashtra, Punjab, Rajasthan and Tamil Nadu have a higher per capita income than other States.

Social audit to monitor urban schemes

The government will soon introduce a 'social audit' system for new schemes to promote transparency and accountability in execution. For this consultative committees would be set up at the district level for monitoring implementation of the projects to avoid delays. The committees comprising local MPs co-chaired by District Collector, would also examine the resource position of urban local bodies and their ability to execute projects. Read more <u>here</u>
