Ongoing Query

Drafting Public Interest Litigation for Effective Devolution of Powers to Panchayats. Advice and Examples

Panchayats are meant to be autonomous institutions of self-government however they are treated as subordinate authorities at present. There is a wide variation in the devolution of powers to the panchayats across states. Further power, authority and responsibilities of Panchayats as envisaged in the Article 243G could not be exercised, as the State Governments were unable to empower them to collect taxes under Article 243H and Finance Commissions were formed under Article 243-I to initiate measures to improve financial position of Panchayats. Hence panchayats are not in a position to undertake the responsibilities in respect of items stated in Schedule XI of the Constitution. Also various Centrally Sponsored Schemes (CSS), which are under the purview of Panchayats, are being directly implemented in a mission mode approach. There is a need for reviewing CSS to enable State Governments to devolve power and functions to PRIs. Such review can be enforced through Public Interest Litigation (PIL) to the Supreme Court highlighting the above issues. Members are requested

to comment and share their insights on:

- Whether it is necessary to seek time bound directions from Supreme Court to the State Governments to implement the 73rd Constitutional amendment?
- What are the administrative advantages /disadvantages of implementing CSS through Societies instead of departments of state governments or through Panchayats?
- How many states have constituted Finance Commissions under article 243I? Are the findings
 of the State Finance Commissions constituted so far, available in the public domain under
 article-4 of RTI Act?

e-Governance may become reality in 2.5 lakh villages by March 2016

As many as 2.5 lakh gram panchayats are likely to start enjoying e-Governance citizen-centric services offered over digital platforms by March 2016 next year as the National Optical Fibre Network (NOFN) project is expected to be completed by then. People will have better access to healthcare, education and business opportunities, and connect themselves directly with the government. Under this around 7 lakh km of optical fibre cable (OFC) will be laid to connect village panchayats with broadband. The government has decided to reach 50,000 gram panchayats this year, one lakh next year and another one lakh panchayats a year after.

Intel to deliver digital literacy across 1000 village panchayats

The company has announced plans for training persons at the panchayat levels of 1,000 villages that are set to receive broadband connectivity under the National Optic Fibre Network. The US-based chipmaker said that it will work with the Government through this programme to impact at least 5 million Indians by 2015.

Nirmal Gram Puraskar to 15 Haryana village panchayats

Fifteen village panchayats of Haryana have been selected for Nirmal Gram Puraskaar-2013 under Prime Minister Narendra Modi's initiative 'Swachh Bharat Mission'. Five out of the 15 village panchayats, have been selected from district Gurgaon alone. Overall 587 Gram panchayats from all over the country have been selected for Nirmal Gram Puraskaar-2013 under Swachh Bharat Mission.

Gujarat first to achieve over 100cr e-governance transactions

According to a statistical report by eTaal — a Central government portal that disseminates etransaction statistics — Gujarat accounts for 27 percent of the total 373 crore e-transactions services provided by all state government services in the past two years. Gujarat has recorded 100.3 crore etransactions between January 1, 2013 and November 26, 2014 through over 58 crore e-transactions services provided under state government projects.

Gujarat Government notifies 50% quota for women in local bodies

Gujarat Government has notified the Gujarat Local Authorities Laws (Amendment) Act, 2009 which has a provision of 50% reservation for women in urban and rural local bodies. The government, however, has excluded the controversial provision for compulsory voting from purview of the Act.

Madhya Pradesh: Panchayat elections to be held in three phases

The fifth panchayat election for 3.92 lakh posts of zila, janpad and gram panchayats in Madhya Pradesh would be held in three phases, starting December 2014. Elections would be held in 50 zila panchayats out of total 51. Voting for posts of panch and sarpanch would be conducted through ballot papers while EVMs would be used for the posts of zila and janpad panchayat members.

Karnataka government drafting right to recall bill for rural voters

State government proposes to introduce a bill that will empower rural voters to recall their representatives from gram panchayats The Karnataka government plans to introduce a bill that will empower rural voters to recall elected representatives to gram panchayat, including president, if they are perceived to have failed to meet expectations.

Companies funding schemes under Adarsh Gram to be counted under corporate social responsibility

With parliamentarians crying foul over dearth of funds to implement the Sansad Adarsh Gram Yojana, the Corporate Affairs Ministry has cleared the decks for companies to fund schemes at the village level by tying up with the Lok Sabha members concerned and count the spending under the mandatory Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) head. Now the companies can tie up with MPs to fund the Adarsh Gram Yojana scheme in adopted villages.

Bhuvan Panchayats 2.0 released

Bhuvan Panchayats 2.0 is the Space based Information Support for Decentralized Planning (SIS-DP) project. Formulated by National Remote Sensing Centre (NRSC), SIS-DP ISRO is being implemented in partnership with State Remote Sensing Application Centres in the country. It provides 'Satellite Image Maps' for the entire country as base for decentralized planning, prepare thematic & base layers on 1:10000 scale, create databank, organize census data, climate data, other stakeholder's data. Comprehensive web portal as per PRI's and stakeholder's needs for decentralized planning, governance, and outreach to the citizens can also be developed.

Solar lamps cut down power bill for panchayats

Vizayan Medu village near Tiruchi has realized the importance of solar street lamps. There has been an increasing awareness among the rural local bodies about the importance of solar street lamps as: it can be easily installed at any place (from pathway to grave yard); minimizes the recurring expenditure on power consumption bills; and avoid road accidents at junction places where two or three roads converge.

Good News: Democracy's better half

Exclusive women's village councils (gram sabhas) are beginning to make a difference in India's rural areas. The concept of a mahila gram sabha was first discussed in Maharashtra, which later became the first state to legislate on it under the Panchayati Raj Act. In 2003, the Maharashtra government issued a circular for conducting mahila gram sabha meetings ahead of the gram sabha. This was made the law in 2012 under the Panchayati Raj Act. Since 2009, mahila gram sabhas have been piloted under the UN programme, Promoting Women's Political Leadership and Gender Responsive Governance.

Budget Track on the Fourteenth Finance Commission

Centre for Budget and Governance Accountability (CBGA) is a think tank based in New Delhi that works on government finances. CBGA's latest edition of Budget Track on the Fourteenth Finance Commission looks at issues faced by the 14th Finance Commission namely, the diminution of its Constitutional role, concerns about its terms of reference, centre-state fiscal relations, fiscal policy space, shortage of human resources, lack of absorptive capacity of the states, financing local governments, development of renewable energy, transparency, accountability and participation.

What Explains the Success of Participatory Budgeting? Evidence from Seoul Autonomous Districts (By Intae Choi, Yonsei University)

This study examines the association between the success of participatory budgeting and a number of variables that characterizes the participatory process in light of the participatory budgeting recently adopted by autonomous districts in Seoul. The study has taken into consideration three variables (the number, attendance rate, and level of expertise of the participatory budgeting committee members), and it examines the association between these three variables and the success of the participatory process, as measured by the amount of budget included in the official budget of the district. It was found that the level of expertise of the committee members has a significant positive association with the measured level of success of the participation.

Governors' Role and Tribal Areas (an EPW article by <u>Sonum Gayatri Malhotra</u>, Centre for Policy Research, New Delhi)

This article states that the institution of the governor has been sidelined in the administering of tribal areas despite clear constitutional guidelines to the contrary. At least apropos this issue, it begs the question whether the institution is relevant to Indian democracy, but for a start, the empowerment of the role of governor is a must.

Under the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee (MGNREG) Act 2005, it is mandated for every Gram Sabha to conduct regular Social Audits of all the projects under the MGNREG Scheme taken up within the Gram Panchayat. To this effect, social Audits were conducted in all the 62 Gram Panchayats of Kurai block of Seoni district of Madhya Pradesh. The Social Audit was facilitated by GOI consultants from NIRD, Madhya Pradesh State Social Audit Committee (MPSSAC) and SAMARTHAN, Bhopal.
