



The document highlights some successes, such as: (i) early warning system support to the Philippines; (ii) the design of mobile phone apps which allow users to receive updates on hazards and disasters as they happen in Uzbekistan and the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia; (iii) encouraging resettled communities not to return to flood-prone areas, contributing to a reduction in flood related mortality in 2010 in Mozambique; and (iv) the development of a national seismic risk reduction plan, a national fund for the prevention, mitigation and response to disasters, and the incorporation of risk reduction as both a crosscutting issue and as one of the main pillars of the National Development Strategy 2010-2030 in the Dominican Republic. 

Fellowship Opportunity

The IC4HD Human Development (HD) Fellowships aim to encourage mid-career professionals (academics, civil servants, and civil society practitioners) to analyze critical development issues from the human development perspective, thereby contributing to development theory, and identification of applications and policies that put people at the centre of development debates.

# THE 2013 HD FELLOWSHIPS DEVELOPMENT UNDER THE THEME, "SOCIAL SECURITY IN THE SOUTH"

The IC4HD 2013 HD Fellowships support **three month programmes,** beginning **August 12**, which do not involve empirical work with data collection and fieldwork during the fellowship period. **The research supported under the 2013 fellowship programme must focus on a well-defined aspect of human development under the theme** *of social security in the South.* **Fellows must have relevant work experience of about 5-8 years, and be nationals of countries from the Asia-Pacific region (please refer to Annex I in the flyer available below). Preference will be given to applicants from least developed countries in the region. Up to seven fellowships will be awarded in 2013.** 

The selected fellows will receive US\$3,000 per month. The Fellowship covers the living expenses for the Fellow as well as a return airfare to the country of residence. **Free, furnished residential accommodation will be provided at IIAS.** The fellowship also envisages the provision of a budget of up to US\$1,000 for attendance of a conference/a short course in India, if relevant to the fellowship theme.

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

Applications are invited from all candidates who fulfill the following eligibility criteria:

- Citizen of a country in the Asia-Pacific region (see flyer)
- · Less than 45 years in age
- 5-8 years of relevant working experience
- Not a UN staff member or a Indian Institute of Advanced Study staff/fellow

This is a residential fellowship offered at the Indian Institute of Advanced Study (IIAS), Shimla, India, for the duration of 3 months.

#### **APPLICATION PROCESS**

Applicants whose native language is not English are expected to have the ability to write and converse fluently in English. All candidates must complete a formal application in English, including:

- Application form (available online)
- Summary statement of the objectives of the proposal
- · Project proposal, not exceeding 1,000 words, which does not involve fieldwork with data collection
- Curriculum vitae
- Two references (email and telephone number should be indicated). One of the referees should be the current supervisor
