### **Protecting development from disasters: UNDP's support to the Hyogo Framework for Action**

This publication highlights the results that UNDP has achieved since 2005, in supporting disaster risk reduction (DRR) and recovery in countries prone to disasters. As a first comprehensive report outlining UNDP's contribution to the implementation of the Hyogo Framework for Action, the report illustrates the reforms that countries and communities are undertaking, with UNDP support, to become more disaster resilient. The document highlights some successes, such as: (i) early warning system support to the Philippines; (ii) the design of mobile phone apps which allow users to receive updates on hazards and disasters as they happen in Uzbekistan and the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia; (iii) encouraging resettled communities not to return to flood-prone areas, contributing to a reduction in flood related mortality in 2010 in Mozambique; and (iv) the development of a national seismic risk reduction plan, a national fund for the prevention, mitigation and response to disasters, and the incorporation of risk reduction as both a crosscutting issue and as one of the main pillars of the National Development Strategy 2010-2030 in the Dominican Republic. 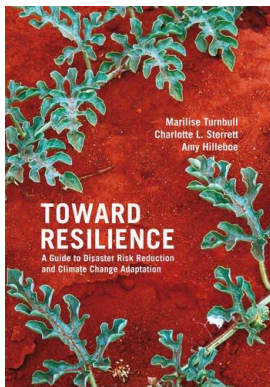

Toward Resilience: A Guide to Disaster Risk Reduction and Climate Change Adaptation is an introductory resource for development and humanitarian practitioners working with populations at risk of disasters and other impacts of climate change. It is aimed at program management, advisory and technical staff of development and humanitarian organizations, and seeks to strengthen staff understanding of the basic approaches and principals that can be applied to disaster risk reduction and climate change adaptation initiatives. It also provides practical guidance on how to integrate disaster risk reduction and climate change adaptation into the program cycle and adapt activities to a range of contexts and development and humanitarian sectors. This guide includes examples from practitioners' experiences that illustrate good practice and learning, and suggests tools and resources that practitioners find useful. This book is a core resource developed as part of the Emergency Capacity Building (ECB) project. The ECB Project is a collaborative effort comprised of six agencies: CARE International, Catholic Relief Services, Mercy Corps, Oxfam, Save the Children and World Vision International.

Preference will be given to applicants from least developed countries in the region. Up to seven fellowships will be awarded in 2013.

The selected fellows will receive US\$3,000 per month. The Fellowship covers the living expenses for the Fellow as well as a return airfare to the country of residence. **Free, furnished residential accommodation will be provided at IIAS.** The fellowship also envisages the provision of a budget of up to US\$1,000 for attendance of a conference/a short course in India, if relevant to the fellowship theme.

## IC4HD HUMAN DEVELOPMENT FELLOWSHIPS



The IC4HD Human Development (HD) Fellowships aim to encourage mid-career professionals (academics, civil servants, and civil society practitioners) to analyse critical development issues from the human development perspective, thereby contributing to development theory, and identification of applications and policies that put people at the centre of development debates.

The objectives of the IC4HD HD Fellowships are to:

- Support innovative analytical work on a particular theme, selected annually, from the human development perspective.
- Identify actionable goals that could be prioritized in development initiatives in the South based on the existing evidence and analysis.
- Promote South-South learning and sharing of expertise and experiences.
- Promote a network of experts who can identify innovative options for policy measures in the global South.

This is a residential fellowship offered at the [Indian Institute of Advanced Study \(IIAS\), Shimla, India](#), for the duration of 3 months. As the IIAS organizes several national level seminars every year, on themes of pressing contemporary relevance as well as of theoretical significance, the fellowship provides the opportunity to interact with scholars from various other fields.

**THE 2013 HD FELLOWSHIPS**

The IC4HD 2013 HD Fellowships support three month programmes, beginning August 12, which do not involve empirical work with data collection and fieldwork during the fellowship period. The research supported under the 2013 fellowship programme must focus on a well-defined aspect of human development under the theme of social security in the South. Fellows must have relevant work experience of about 5-8 years, and be nationals of countries from the Asia-Pacific region (please refer to Annex I). Preference will be given to applicants from least developed countries in the region. Up to seven fellowships will be awarded in 2013.

**ELIGIBILITY**

Applications are invited from all candidates who fulfil the following eligibility criteria:

- Citizen of a country in the Asia-Pacific region (see Annex I)
- Less than 45 years in age
- 5-8 years of relevant working experience
- Not a full-time member of an Indian Institute of Advanced Study staff/fellow

The other selection criteria, which will be considered to shortlist applications, include:

- Educational qualifications: post-graduate degree desirable
- Exceptional creativity in choice of topic
- Value addition or new direction to the human development concept, methodology, analysis, application and policy relevance
- Track record of past accomplishments
- Time needed for completing the work



**Theme for 2013:**  
**SOCIAL SECURITY IN THE SOUTH**

The HD approach, with an inherent emphasis on human rights and entitlements, has a strong focus on equity and social justice. The Universal Declaration of Human Rights states that "Everyone, as a member of society, has the right to social security" (Article 22). In Article 25 this is further elaborated.

Social security can be viewed "essentially as an objective pursued through public means rather than a narrowly defined set of particular strategies" (Cress and Sen 1989). Two different aspects of social security are protection (which is concerned with preventing a decline in living standards as might occur for example during an economic recession) and promotion (which is concerned with the enhancement of general living standards and to the expansion of basic capabilities of the population).

While nearly all countries offer some form of social security, access remains largely limited. Only a small fraction of the global population is able to access existing schemes. As such, the fellowships will contribute to address, inter alia, the following questions:

- How can embedding social security concerns into development policy effectively respond to poverty and exclusion?
- How have strategic plans and programmes taken into account social security concerns and core issues in countries of the global South? How successful have these initiatives been?
- What are the lessons learnt and good practices from a human development perspective?

Based on the existing evidence and analysis, and comparisons among countries and regions, the fellowships will contribute to identify actionable goals that could be prioritized in development initiatives in countries in the South.

**APPLICATION PROCESS**

Applicants whose native language is not English are expected to have the ability to write and converse fluently in English. All candidates must complete a formal application in English, including:

- Application form (available online)
- Summary statement of the objectives of the proposal
