Dear Members,

The Disaster Management Community of Practice organised National Consultation on Enhancing knowledge and Innovation for effective disaster risk reduction in India on 6 December, 2014 at New Delhi and webcasted the event to reach out to members across the country, who couldn't come to Delhi. The National Consultation addressed two main issues - Identifying Knowledge Partnerships and Strategic Collaborations; Expanding Community Outreach across multiple languages using new Technologies. Around 60 members were present in the consultation at Delhi and equal number of members participated through webcast. As a part of the consultation, a query was posted in the afternoon with reply time of 2 hours, which received about 31 responses. The consultation paved way for enhancing active participation of the members.

This was followed by a live-query discussion on 26 December 2014 to observe the 10th Anniversary of Indian Ocean Tsunami in collaboration with Saferworld Communications. The day long discussion attracted nearly 90 responders from various sectors, professions and countries. Each of the responses was an expression of solidarity with the affected communities. These also contained messages/suggestions to the World Conference on Disaster Risk Reduction -2015. The messages received during the live-discussion urged world leaders to commit for a Safer World with investments for reducing risks rather than response.

The year 2014 has seen pro-active involvement of large number of members, encouraging the resource team to undertake innovative mediums to reach out to the members. The Government has also announced reconstitution of the National Disaster Management Authority. We hope the slimmer structure of this apex body will focus on immediate requirements with a long term vision. As we step into the new year 2015, we look forward to members to enable DM CoP to reach out to the last person in the last mile for building an environment for Disaster Risk Reduction and Climate Change Adaptation.

The key topic for the Community Update No: 127 is on 10th anniversary of Indian Ocean Tsunami. Wish you all happy new year -2015.
