Dear Members,

There has been series of Cloudburst incidents in Jammu and Kashmir State in the month of July 2015 beginning 12th -Pahalgam, 17th -Sonmarg and 24th – Baltal, leading to fatalities, casualties and persons missing. This has also led to scores of of tents and vehicles being been washed away by the gushing waters. Sonamarg-Kargil National Highway was closed for traffic after the flash



floods washed away a portion of the road. The Amarnath Yatra was also temporarily suspended. The Indian Army, CRPF, J & K Police and Civil Administration were assisting Search, Rescue and Relief Operations. (source: http://www.ndtv.com/topic/cloudburst-in-kashmir).

Cloudburst occurred in Uttarakhand's upper reaches of Tehri district early on 23rd Thursday morning and brought devastation to village Jaspur. The widespread devastation swept away farm animals and acres of farming land is flooded (source: http://www.ndtv.com/topic/uttarakhand-cloudburst).

The increasing occurrence of Cloudburst in Jammu and Kashmir; Uttarakhand has also caused landslides. These disaster events indicates the need to understand the Climate Change processes and initiate appropriate Disaster Risk Reduction measures in the Himalayan Region.

The Cyclone Komen has brought High velocity storms that have flattened hundreds of houses, rendered over 800 people homeless and injured at least 12 people in Howrah, Burdwan and Nadia districts of West Bengal State. According to a senior Met Department official Heavy to very heavy rains is expected along the Gangetic areas on 31st July and 1st August 2015 and this will hamper the relief work. The storm flattened about 400 kuchcha houses, uprooted 3,000 trees and 200 electric posts in Kalyani sub-division of Nadia district (source: <u>http://indianexpress.com/article/cities/kolkata/cyclone</u>).

The study proposes an innovative technology called "life towers" and examines its potential to provide practical solution to enhance the early warning capacities to detect local settlement inundations leading to reduced loss of lives. The overall goal of the study is to determine if the technology is appropriate for further testing by assessing its relevance and suitability to the needs of the end beneficiaries and humanitarian practitioners in India. Amreli Flood Report- 2015

On 24th June 2015, Amreli district experienced rainfall of 2580 mm which was around 4 times of average annual rainfall recorded in the last 10 years. The flash floods, affected 110 villages of Amreli district of which 73 villages were severely affected. The flash flood resulted in loss of thousands of cattle and wild animals. The flood water affected roads, electricity, and water supply in a big way. Thousands of Electric poles got uprooted in 585 villages and almost all the telecommunication towers in four talukas of Amreli, Bagasara, Savarkundala and Kukavav-Vadia were adversely affected

On 29 July 2015, United Nations-backed plan to develop and pilot disaster risk management standards for the hotel industry in Asia and the Pacific, home to 80 per cent of the world's disaster events, was announced by UNISDR. A joint study carried out by UNISDR, the Pacific Asia Travel Association (PATA) and the Global Initiative on Disaster Risk Management (GIDRM) has found significant interest in setting standards among hoteliers, tour operators, tourism bodies, government agencies and insurance companies in the Philippines, Indonesia, Thailand and the Maldives. Nepal

Heavy rainfall affected western Nepal over the last couple of days. 116 mm (4.56 inches) of rain was measured in Pokhara city in a 24 hour period, between July 29 and July 30. Landslides has buried around half of the homes in the Lumle village by a strong and fast moving stream of mud and rocks. , killing 30 people. According to Krishna Bahadur Raut, Chief District Officer of Kaski District, About 30 are dead and 42 still missing.
