Dear Members,

The UN Sustainable Development Summit- 2015, for "<u>Transforming our World: the 2030 agenda for Sustainable</u> <u>Development</u>", was held from 25-27 September 2015 at UN Headquarters in New York. Heads of State and Government and other high-level representatives, business leaders and civil society activists delivered statements in plenary during



the three-day Summit. Delegates also took part in six interactive dialogues on the topics of - ending poverty and hunger; tackling inequalities, empowering women and girls and leaving no one behind; fostering sustainable economic growth, transformation and promoting sustainable consumption and production; delivering on a revitalized Global Partnership; building effective, accountable and inclusive institutions to achieve sustainable development; and protecting our planet and combating climate change. Many other events and bilateral meetings took place alongside the Summit. In total, over 9,000 participants, including 136 Heads of State and Government, ministers, business leaders, and civil society attended the UN Sustainable Development Summit.(source: IISD reporting services).

Over the last four years, the UNISDR Step-Up Campaign focused on Children (2011), Women and Girls (2012), Persons Living with Disabilities (2013) and Older Persons (2014). The goal of this year's international day for DRR (13th October 2015) is **"Knowledge for Life"** with focus on the *traditional, indigenous and local knowledge which complement modern science and add to an individual's and societies' resilience.* We understand that many of the practioners will be involved in organising the IDDR day on 13th and hence request to share actions taken at the ground level with DM CoP for dissemination.

National Disaster Management Authority Formation Day

The National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) observed its 11th Formation Day on 28th September 2015 at Vigyan Bhawan, New Delhi. The event was inaugurated by Shri. Kiran Rijiju, Minister of State for Home Affairs. He stressed on capacity development of stakeholders as a very critical component towards effective risk reduction especially at the institutional level. In the inaugural session, the first edition of NDMAs Quarterly Newsletter SAMVAD was also released.

The day long program held four technical sessions related to four major



calamities, namely, Cvclone, Earthquake, Floods and Landslides. The broad framework of NDMAs proposed the pilot projects on Earthquake, Cyclone, Floods and Landslides were discussed and deliberated in each of the technical sessions.

The Addl. Principal Secretary to the Prime Minister, Dr. P. K Mishra was the Chief Guest for Valedictory session. He congratulated NDMA team for successfully addressing the relief, response and rehabilitation efforts in Kashmir and Nepal. He further mentioned that it would be important to manage the multifaceted nature of risk in times to come and therefore it is important to invest in capacity building at technical, managerial and operative areas in preparedness and response in the country.

Japan floods: City of Joso hit by 'unprecedented' rain



Unprecedented rain in Japan unleashed heavy floods on 10th September 2015 that tore houses from their foundations, uprooted trees and forced more than 100,000 people from their homes.

The city of Joso, north of the capital, Tokyo, was hit by a wall of water after the Kinugawa River burst its banks. The rains come a day after a tropical storm brought winds of up to 125km/h (78mph) to central Aichi prefecture.

Stampede at Hajj pilgrimage



At least 717 people taking part in the Hajj pilgrimage have been killed in a stampede and another 863 people were injured in the incident at Mina, near the Islamic holy city of Mecca, Saudi Arabia on 24th September 2015. It is the second disaster to strike Mecca in two weeks, after a crane collapsed at the Grand Mosque, killing 109 people.
