Community Activities



1. Run up to the 20 years of Decentralization in India

To commemorate 20 years of the 73rd Amendment in India, we launched 3 activities:

- a) **Survey** to map perceptions, thoughts on the relevance and significance of decentralization in India. We received 23 responses
- b) **Stories of Change**: Collation of Stories of elected leaders, activists engaged in making decentralization effective and a reality in India. We received video clips, stories from across the country.
- C) E-discussion: Relevance of decentralization in India and ways to strengthen Panchayats; e-discussion; from Anshuman Karol, PRIA, Delhi Provides a space for members to share experiences, successes, failures, look at opportunities and talk about the roadblocks vis-à-vis decentralization. This e-discussion was a space for Members to "say it out". Closed on 25th April 2013. Based on the responses received, we will be posting the survey results, releasing the stories of change and initiating a new e-discussion on Role of Civil Society Organizations and Donors in strengthening Decentralization in India Experiences; Advice.

2. Consolidated Replies Issued

Linking Grassroots Practitioners in Knowledge Sharing Processes; Experiences; Examples Strategies; from Prema Gera, UNDP, India; Issued on 11th April 2013. The query seeks inputs on various innovative mechanisms and technologies that facilitate to and fro process of knowledge sharing for grassroots practitioners. The query invited suggestions on cultural, technological and linguistic shifts that need to be made in order to take knowledge sharing to the grassroots.

3. Events

Consultation on Recommendatory Role for Local Governments to address Violence against Women (VAW), 15 April 2013, Jaipur

The Consultation was organized to take the e-discussion on Recommendatory Role for Local Governments to address Violence against Women (VAW) initiated by the Gender and Decentralization Solution Exchange in January 2013 ahead. It brought together respondents, activists, experts, Panchayat representatives to help chart recommendations for addressing VAW through local governments. The objective was to provide a platform for Panchayat representatives to share cases where Panchayats have demonstrated a proactive role in supporting access to justice and awareness generation regarding VAW and the support the Panchayats would receive in accomplishing the same. Out of 75 participants, 30 were elected representatives from Rajasthan, Maharashtra and Uttar Pradesh. The CSO/NGO representatives, legal and academic experts as well as local activists along with elected representatives shared their experiences and brainstormed on possible ways forward. We will be sharing the consultation report shortly.

Prime Minister calls for giving responsibilities and power to panchayats in real terms

The Prime Minister, Dr. Manmohan Singh inaugurated the National conference to celebrate the National Panchayati Raj Day at Vigyan Bhawan. Speaking at the event, the PM said that the purpose of decentralization was that the citizens have a hand in administrative decision making at the local level. However this would only be enabled with transfer of real responsibilities and powers to elected representatives and not just in name. Read more

Under the Incremental PSI Awards 1st Prize is won by Karnataka, 2nd Prize Rajasthan, 3rd Prize Maharashtra and 4th Prize is won by Odisha
