who were recruited as coordinators for the Expo which was slated from 28th October to 1st November 2013. The UNV also opened up opportunities for Online volunteers to help in disseminating and sharing the Expo proceedings and solutions via social media. Over five hundred youth attended the session, while thousands more followed it via Social Media platforms as Twitter, Facebook and Meeting Words.
