The Citizens' Information Satisfaction System (CSIS) available in 68 public institutions measures citizens' satisfaction with 600 services



Enhanced citizens' safety and community confidence building

7 municipalities have Safer Community Plans which are synchronized with local Operational Policing Plans

Restoration of 7 cultural heritage sites in 4 multi-ethnic municipalities (Lipjan/Lipljan, Kamenicë/Kamenica, Gjilan/Gnjilane, and Ferizaj/Uroševac)

Over 200 people enjoy greater awareness about promotion and protection of cultural heritage



Small arms control

7,055 weapons and 28,000 round of ammunition confiscated and destroyed

40,000 weapons are registered in the database and the software is linked to 36 police stations

Prevention of violent extremism and strengthened security

1 pilot referral mechanism established in Gjilan/Gnjilane

Support to the development of an assessment of the prison management and rehabilitation/reintegration of returned foreign fighters and their families

Awareness raising about prevention of violent extremism through the organization of 15 municipal town hall meetings



Support to the Stabilisation and Association Agreement (SAA) process

50 different public policies, strategies, action plans and laws designed and approved in areas of public administration, justice and security sector

Joint UNDP and Ministry of European Integration communication campaign on the requirements and obligation from the SAA initiated

Businesses from the textile industry, wood-processing, construction, ICT, and metal processing, improved their knowledge of SAA requirements



Support to anti-corruption efforts

Global Organization of Parliamentarians Against Corruption (GOPAC) Chapter established by the Assembly of Kosovo

Integrity plans developed and implemented in 17 municipalities, 3 Ministries, and 2 independent institutions

From 2012-2016 7,268 corruption cases were reported through Kallxo.com, of which 5,375 were processed and 726 referred to rule of law institutions









Resilience against climate change

174,000 people improved their awareness on climate change, the protection of agricultural land, forestation and reforestation, forest protection and landscape protection, water savings and water conservation

173 farmers, students and municipal officials empowered with knowledge on the impact of climate change in the water, forestry and agricultural sectors

8,000 seedlings planted in the Sharr/Šar Mountain as a mitigation measure of the Greenhouse Gas emissions

Legislative framework in the climate sector enhanced with legal analysis for harmonization of legislation with the aquis and action plan and monitoring plan for Climate Change Strategy



Disaster risk reduction

110 participants including 30 women increased their awareness on disaster reduction on 13 October through the commemoration of International Day for Disaster Reduction

Over 500 people, including 200 students, learned about the no-cost 112 number for emergencies through events organized on European Emergency Number 112 Day and promotion of online quizzes for children on EMA website

3 additional local risk assessment documents for municipalities of Ranillugë / Ranilug; Partesh / Parteš and Kllokot / Klokot, and 1 additional municipal disaster response plan developed for Pejë/Peã

Kosovo Disaster Risk Reduction Strategy approved, and a manual / toolkit for community-based drills was developed

Emergency response to flooding

Strengthened coordination between the Municipalities of Malishevë/Mališevo and Gllogoc/Glogovac and the Emergency Management Agency (EMA)


Provided tools for search and rescue for flooding such as pumps, fisherman's boots and mobile light among other things.

2 infrastructural works completed to strengthen resilience against future flooding



Environment and Health

#ecokosovo advocacy campaign conducted jointly with UN Volunteers, World Health Organization



More than 540,000 viewers all over Kosovo reached, over 260,000 pieces of social media engagement created, and 600+ photos submissions received



Transboundary Drini River basin management

A series of Transboundary Diagnostic analyses were completed to identify the main issues of transboundary concern and root causes, and stakeholder needs.

Transboundary Expert Working Groups established on 1) Water Framework Directives, 2) Biodiversity and Ecosystems, and 3) Monitoring and Information Exchange.







Public Pulse

2,612 citizens' perceptions demonstrate their views on issues related to:

- Socio-economic conditions
- Political situation
- Inter-ethnic relations

- Democratization index
- Public safety and security
- Corruption levels

One Action Paper prepared and launched in cooperation with Kosovo Customs, treating the topic; "The influence of complex procedures on corruption stimulation in Kosovo Customs".

Perceptions of citizens of Kosovo on the prevalence of corruption, with particular emphasis on Kosovo public institutions on both central and local level presented through a special edition of Public Pulse.



Kosovo Mosaic

Stronger understanding about the perceptions on the quality of public services and performance of local authorities gathered by reaching out to 6,700 citizens

38 municipalities benefited from an analysis of trends in terms of the overall satisfaction of Kosovans with public services and local government institutions

The online visualization platform introduced in 2016 facilitates the usage of data from the survey, increases citizens' engagement in policymaking at the local level, and enhances accountability and transparency

The Western Balkans region is prone to the following natural hazards: earthquakes, floods, droughts, heatwaves, wildfires, and extreme weather events and climate change



7 population groups most vulnerable to disasters are: 1) poor people, 2) women, 3) children and the elderly, 4) persons with disability, 5) minorities, 6) migrants, returnees and internally displaced persons, and 7) farmers.

"Making the labour market work for women and youth"



More than 65% of unemployed women stated that they would not be able to start working in the next two weeks even if they got a job because of personal or family responsibilities



More women (89.8%) than men (73.5%) who are currently unemployed have never been in regular employment
