# GIRLS AND EDUCATION

773 mln adults are **ILLITERATE** globally<sup>1</sup>



2/3 of them are women (approximately 515 mln)<sup>1</sup>

258 mln children, adolescents and youth (17%) are OUT OF SCHOOL<sup>2</sup>



130 mln between the age of 6 and 17 are OUT OF SCHOOL3

#### MAIN BARRIERS TO GIRLS' EDUCATION<sup>4</sup>



Harmful gender stereotypes and unequal social norms and values



Gender-based violence against women and girls



Lack of inclusive and quality learning environment and inadequate and unsafe education infrastructure, including sanitation (e.g. lack of female teachers, discriminatory curricula, learning materials, and teaching methods)



Child marriage and early and unintended pregnancy





## PANDEMIC IMPACT ON EDUCATION<sup>5</sup>





90% schools closed worldwide



800 mln girls affected<sup>6</sup>



additional children and youth (from pre-primary to tertiary) may drop out or have no access to school next year due to the pandemic's economic impact alone



**1,6** bln

learners across all ages (94%) in 200 countries affected by the pandemic



80-85% coverage in HIGH income countries

over 50% coverage in LOW income countries



<30% increase in socio-economic SKILLS GAP


