

The conflict in Syria still continues to drive the largest refugee crisis in the world – there are over 5.6 million Syrian refugees registered, with over 2.6 million being children, in a region faced with deepening economic, social and development challenges.

Host countries have demonstrated outstanding generosity to Syrian refugees for many years despite the huge pressure on national services and infrastructure – the international community must enhance their support to these countries on the front line, providing a global public good.

The deteriorating situation inside many parts of Syria make clear that conditions are not in place voluntary return of refugees in safety and dignity. It is therefore essential that we continue our support to address the needs of refugees and impacted and vulnerable host communities.

As the search for a political solution continues, and after years of protracted displacement, we also need to sharpen our focus on solutions for Syrian refugees, including resettlement and expanding access to complementary pathways.

Refugee families have become increasingly vulnerable with each passing year of displacement: poverty rates exceed 80% in some host countries; some 35% of Syrian refugee children are out-of-school; and early marriage and forced child labour are compounded by lack of livelihoods. Meanwhile, Palestinian refugees continue to face particular vulnerabilities.

The total 3RP requirements for 2018 are USD 5.6 billion to assist over nine million people with protection, humanitarian and resilience support. The includes up to USD 1.2 billion in multi-year funding, as well as USD 4.4 billion appealed for by UN and NGO partners.

The 3RP is approximately 27 per cent funded as of the end of Q1 against the total requirements of USD 5.6 billion.

Unless more funding is urgently received, critical programmes face closure or reduction in the coming months, which will result in more children out of education, more families living in poverty, and fewer people earning a livelihood.

Donors are urged to support the 3RP approach and give generously at Brussels, including with increased multi-year commitments. This will enable us to build on the 3RP's tangible achievements, and sustain them in the longer-term for Syrian refugees and host communities.

3RP partners will continue to build on the progress made on access to livelihoods and further supporting national and local authorities to deliver basic social services which has proven to increase self-reliance and lessen dependence on direct assistance.

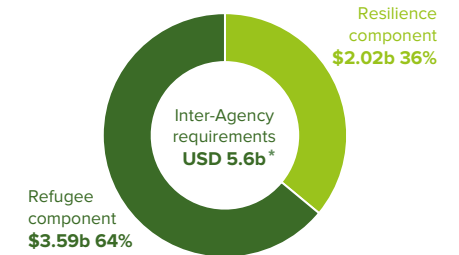

RRP/3RP 2012-2017 KEY ACHIEVEMENTS

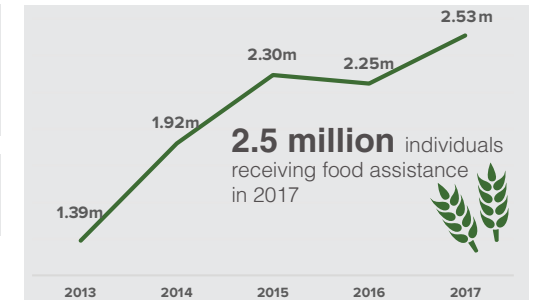
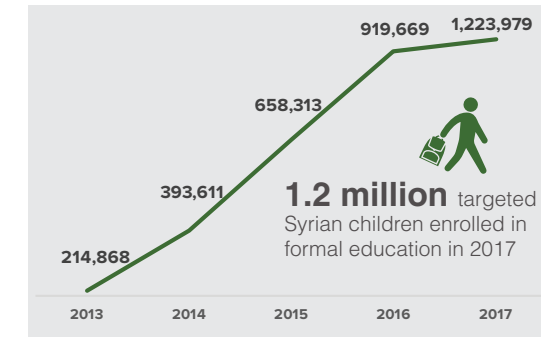
Operational Achievements

Since 2012, the RRP/3RP response has provided protection and assistance to over 5 million Syrian refugees and millions more host community members, as well as support to the national systems and services that support them in host communities. This host community support is vital in a context where more than 90 per cent of the refugee caseload lives in urban, peri-urban or rural areas, rather than camps. Some of the RRP/3RP achievements since 2012 are outlined below.

169,000 Syrians submitted for resettlement

94 per cent of Syrian refugees now have updated registration records including iris scan enrolment

Over **784,000** children have received specialized child protection services



4,990 classrooms constructed, established or rehabilitated

248,892 individuals supported to access employment (trainings, internships, job placement and language courses)

At least **2.7 million** individuals have benefited from improved access to adequate quantity of safe water and **1.5 million** individuals benefited from access to adequate latrines

At least **1.4 million** individuals benefited from shelter solutions

13.9 million consultations in primary health care services and **1,515** health facilities supported
