


Profile of Women in **Decision-Making Process**

Note: Managers of all levels = Group 1 of the RM Classification of Occupations; Legislators, chief executives, senior officials and heads of public administration = Group 11 of the RM Classification of Occupations

By the type of occupation, 1 in 2 mangers of all levels is a woman (48%)



Out of 10 women managers of all levels:



Half are aged 15-44 vears old (49.5%)



Half are aged 45-64 years old (49,5%)



over 65 years old (1%)

7 women have higher education (70%)



3/4 work in urban areas (75%)

work as employees receving salaries and 1 works on her own account



1 in 7 positions with special status


