






ENHANCING ACCESS TO JUSTICE THROUGH INSTITUTIONAL REFORM PROJECT

The 'Enhancing Access to Justice through Institutional Reform Project (A2J Project) focuses on the reform of the legal aid system, supporting national efforts in implementation of constitutional provisions on fundamental rights through legislative reform, implementation of the newly adopted criminal and civil legislations, and in particular on enhancing the access to justice at the local level.









By 2022, inclusive, democratic, accountable and transparent institutions are further strengthened towards ensuring rule of law, social justice and human rights for all particularly for vulnerable people.



EXPECTED CPAP OUTPUTS

- National level executive and legislative branches of the Government and commissions have the capacities and tools to implement the Constitution, including peaceful transition to federal structure;
- Justice sector institutions strengthened in accordance with the Constitution and human rights standards to ensure greater access to justice.
