1. Brief Summary of the Mission:

A draft of the RFIP was finally made available in November 2018 after numerous delays related to challenges obtaining the required information: financial, projects. As such, work to identify preliminary and potential risks and benefits arising from the implementation of the RFIP could finally commence. This information will be used to revise and further inform the development of the SIS and Sol.

The GEF-7 Expression of Interest (EOI) for the Food System, Land Use and Restoration (FOLUR) Impact Program was endorsed by PNG's GEF Operational Focal Point. This EOI is a collaboration between UNDP FCPF team, Ecosystem and Biodiversity (EBD) team, with contribution from the Green Commodities Program.

2. Key findings:

Safeguards, SIS and SOI

- Gwen Sissiou, in her welcome remarks, emphasized that safeguards are instituted within the mandates of
 government agencies, who will thus be primarily responsible to ensure the rules and guidance provided
 by UNFCCC are met. She also added that various sectors have in place policies and guidance for benefitsharing and as such, should be the starting point for implementation vis-à-vis introducing new benefitsharing distribution policy.
- A detailed list of initial potential risks and benefits arising from the implementation of the activities listed
 in the RFIP was put together by members from the Social and Environmental Safeguards Technical
 Working Committee during a workshop from 22 23 January. Initial recommendations to address these
 risks and enhance the benefits included how the policies and measures (PaMs) could be implemented,
 stakeholders or locations to be involved, as well as potential changes to policies or regulations.
- This list will feed into the on-going work to screen the RFIP activities against UNDP safeguards (SESP) and develop a management framework (ESMF) for the risks identified. These findings will be discussed and verified during a workshop, proposed at the end of March/early April.
