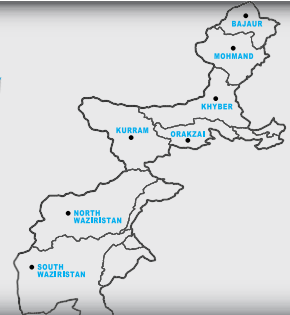
Population of FATA
