PROJECT SUMMARY

FEDERAL LEVEL AND NEWLY ESTABLISHED AUTONOMOUS STATES:

UNDP continued to play a prominent role in the Peace and Statebuilding Goal 4 Working Group on Economic Foundations. The flagship initiative on natural resource management took the form of a UN Joint Programme on Sustainable Charcoal Production and Alternative Livelihoods. The Joint Programme will involve UNEP and FAO and is in response to the UN Security Council resolution 2036 (2012) that seeks international cooperation to ban illegal exports of Charcoal from Somalia and promote alternative sources of energy and livelihoods.

Formal approval was secured for the USD 8.0 million project titled: "Enhancing the Climate Resilience of Vulnerable Communities and Ecosystems" by the Global Environment Facility (GEF)/Least Developed Countries Climate Fund (LDCF). This is the first ever project of this scale to be implemented in Somalia. Two additional pipeline projects developed to mobilise USD 12.0 million from GEF.

25 KVA Solar Energy System installed at Baidoa hospital. On average the hospital will serve 17,000 patients annually.

PUNTLAND:

Solar energy equipments installed in Garowe and Galkayo hospitals. The systems have the capacity of 25 KVA each and would meet 90% of the total energy demand of the hospitals. The solar system is backed up with the local utility and diesel generators. The system will improve access to reliable sources of energy for the hospital and would have major lives and cost savings.

Puntland Environment Conference held in April 2014. Key priorities recommended by conference participants are: a) Introduction of environmental education; b) Implementation of Community based initiatives on natural resources management; c) Validation of environment and disasters management policies through public debates; d) Introduction of alternative sources of energy to combat degradation due to charcoal use. The recommendations of the Conference translated into "Puntland Environment Policy - PEP". PEP approved by the Parliament and President in December 2014.

SOMALILAND:

Somaliland specific adaptation to climate change activities finalized and included in the project to be implemented with the funding from Global Environment Facility (GEF).

UNDP supported Environment Sector Coordination platform was made fully functional. This platform took on its agenda to deal with the challenges around illegal enclosures, using invasive species for charcoal production, disaster response and institutional mapping of organisations with activities for environment improvement.

Capacity building for improved disasters risks mitigation of the Somaliland institutions initiated, in partnership with the National Environment Research and Disasters Management Authority (NERAD). Solar Energy Systems installed and commissioned in public buildings across Somaliland for improved access to reliable sources of energy.

CONTEXTUAL ANALYSIS

FEDERAL LEVEL

The recent change of the Prime Minister of Somalia and expected new Federal Cabinet may impact the pace of UNDP's on-going activities under the environment portfolio. UNDP/GEF Climate Resilience Project is in its inception phase. It is critical to have the GEF focal point in the Federal Government fully involved for smooth start of the project. This shall require close interaction of the Federal Government with the regional governments. UNDP will continue to support Federal Government in mobilizing funding for the National Capacity Self-Assessment (NCSA), Integrated Water Resources Management, formulation of Initial Communication on Climate Change and preparing the National Action Plan to Combat Desertification. UN Joint Programme on Sustainable Charcoal Production and Use is being considered for entry into pipeline of Somali Development and Reconstruction Fund. The component projects under the environment portfolio were aligned to the UN's Integrated Strategic Framework (ISF).

PUNTLAND

The Puntland State Ministry of Environment, Wildlife and Tourism got the approval of the Puntland Environment Policy (PEP) from the Parliament and the President. The PEP provides a comprehensive framework for stand-alone environment actions as well as environment mainstreaming across other thematic areas. UNDP supported the consultations to establish the policy framework and later got involved in the substantive review of the draft document. PEP areas of focus include: a) Protection of rangelands and forest resources; b) Conservation of wildlife and biodiversity; c) Alternative energy development; d) Mining and petroleum; e) Climate change and disaster management; f) Waste management and environmental sanitation; g) Environmental education and awareness; h) Environmental impact assessment and land tenure. Solar energy systems in public buildings were fully commissioned in the last quarter of 2014. The solar systems in hospitals have been highly acknowledged by the State authorities.

SOMALILAND

The Somaliland Ministry of Environment and Rural Development (MoE&RD) has strengthened its regional presence for enforcement of environment policy and monitor actions that have negative impacts for the environment. The key areas of focus for the Ministry include: a) providing alternative sources to charcoal; b) environmental awareness campaigns; c) climate change adaptation; and, d) solid waste management. Inclusion of Environment as one of the five pillars of National Development Plan is helping in better implementation of environment projects as well as mainstreaming of environment across other sectors. UNDP supported Environment Sector Coordination platform took on its agenda to deal with the challenges around illegal enclosures, promoting use of invasive species for charcoal production, disaster response and institutional mapping of organisations with activities for environment improvement. Somaliland Government has acknowledged UNDP for helping in better access to energy.

ACTIVITY HIGHLIGHTS

FEDERAL LEVEL

UNDP continued to play a prominent role in the Peace and State-building Goal 4 Working Group on Economic Foundations. The flagship initiative on natural resource management will take the form of a UN Joint Programme on Sustainable Charcoal Production and Alternative Livelihoods. PEACE AND CONFLICT

Risk mitigation against conflicts is an integral part of all project implementation activities. The environment project works within the UNDP's peace and development framework to highlight potential risks of conflict and opportunities for peace building. All new initiatives to be implemented under the project are reviewed to ensure that conflict prevention and peace building elements are fully integrated at the design and work planning stages.

GENDER

Gender mainstreaming and women's empowerment are critical to the sustainability of initiatives aimed at improving environmental management. It is widely recognized that women are the natural resource managers in developing countries, as they carry the responsibility of harnessing natural resources to meet the basic needs of families.

More specifically, the Environment project is providing alternative energy to hospitals which service at least 27,000 women annually. In addition, it is set to provide energy to Maternal and Child health centers.

REFLECTIONS / LESSONS

Weak institutional structures, and fragile political and security conditions in Somalia prove to be obstacles to the implementation of environment related activities. Although the Environment project has been able to successfully position UNDP to assist FGS in taking the environment agenda forward, the political changes negatively impact the progress towards lasting results. With a new federal set-up in place, efforts will be made to bring clarity and the anchoring of "environment" work in the new institutional structure.

Another challenge has been the omission of a number of flagship (fully-developed and approved) UN/Government joint programmes in the results matrix of the "New Deal Compact" and the the "Economic Recovery Plan" for Somalia. Both supra frameworks consider the unsustainable production and use of charcoal as the key driver causing depletion of economic assets in Somalia. However, both the Compact and ERP appear to have overlooked the UN/Government Joint Programme on Charcoal.

Though the Environment project has been successful in bringing Somalia on the canvas of the global environment financing, there is a need for joint understanding on the urgent need to tackle the environmental issues. The investments in better environmental management will have a direct impact on improving the security conditions and peace building in Somalia – where 80% of population is dependent on the natural resources assets. The commitment of traditional donors in material terms is essential to change the situation from a largely reactive humanitarian response to proactive development centered investments in Somalia.
