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CONTEXTUAL ANALYSIS

FEDERAL LEVEL

The security situation during the quarter remained volatile with a prevailing feeling of tension. Whilst major areas remain inaccessible, the Somali Federal Government and the UN are among the prime targets of Al-Shabaab attacks. On 24 May, a complex attack on the Federal Parliament in Mogadishu by Al-Shabaab left 12 security force members, including three AMISOM soldiers dead and 3 MPs injured.

The Constitution Review and Implementation Committee members (5 persons; including one woman) were nominated in May. The woman is the dynamic and passionate gender advocate and former Minister for Women Development and Family Affairs in Puntland, Asha Gelle Dirie. She has been a long-standing partner of UNDP both within and outside government, presenting a good opportunity to mainstream gender into the work of the commission and secure tangible commitments for women in the finalized Constitution.

PUNTLAND

The Puntland Women Councilors Network (PWCN) consisting of 41 women councilors from 11 districts and 20 women activists from women CSOs including the Head of TAG Foundation and former Puntland Minister of Women Ms Asha Gelle had a special meeting with the President of Puntland in Galkacyo during his State tour. This meeting followed after the new Galkacyo District Council were announced with only 2 women out of 27 members. The PWCN expressed their great disappointment with the results of the Galkacyo newly selected council and despite efforts being made to advocate for the 30% quota for women in seats, the results clearly shows that clan nomination still plays a major role. The President pledged his support to women's political participation and the 30% quota.

SOMALILAND

Ahead of the Somaliland Parliamentary election which is expected to take place in 2015, advocacy for a women's quota has been strengthened over the last quarter through strong networking and collaboration among the stakeholders. NAGAAD is playing the leading role from the Civil society while MOLSA is leading from the Government and lobbying all the government structures including the MDAs. From the executive side, the President of Somaliland speaking at the opening of Kulmiye (Ruling party) General congress meeting on the 28th of April, re-affirmed that his government is committed to the women's quota. He then requested the MPs from his Party to prepare a motion to facilitate legislation on the Women's Quota. This offers a fertile ground on which to redouble advocacy efforts on the quota.

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ACTIVITY HIGHLIGHTS

FEDERAL LEVEL

In collaboration with UNSOM and UN Women, UNDP supported Somali Women Leadership Initiative (SWLI) to convene a national conference in Mogadishu to discuss the role of women in PSG 1 - "Achieve a stable and peaceful federal Somalia through inclusive political processes". The meeting was attended by women from Banadir, Galmuduug, Galgadud, Hiraan, Puntland, Kismayo, and Bay region. Ahead of this meeting, regional consultations were undertaken to take stock of efforts done by women to integrate local, regional and national political and decision making processes, ascertain good practices and lessons learned. H.E. President Hassan Sheikh Mahmoud and SRSG Nicholas Kay both attended and expressed their commitment to women's increased political participation in Somalia.

PUNTLAND

A total of 755 people (411women and 344men) have been reached through community conversation sessions and intergenerational dialogue on issues of gender equality, SGBV and women's rights.

UNDP Gender Unit supported the capacity building of 41 members of Puntland Women's Councilors Network(PWCN) and 20 women CSOs on international gender frameworks, transformational leadership and advocacy skills and development of an action plan to increasing women's participation in the local council.

The study on the Role of Somali Women in the Somali Private Sector was validated in an event attended by government ministers, the private sector, women CSOs which included a panel discussion on the prospects for enhancing women' role in the private sector.

SOMALILAND

A validation workshop on the findings of the Study on the Role of Somali women in the Private sector was conducted. A concept note has been developed and indicated a number of Project development including the Business Support Centre for women in Putland and Somaliland.

Nation wide Gender training for all UNDP Programs, Operations and Support staff on Policies, Programs and Practices, was successfully completed in June, and an Action plan to implement the outcomes of the training is underway.

A project review meeting, that reflected on the quarters achievement and committed for the next quarter was conducted.

PARTNERSHIPS

In collaboration with UNWomen, UNDP provided support to a Workshop on transformational political leadership for Somalia Women Political Leaders, including female MPs, that was held in Addis Ababa Ethiopia on 12th -17th May 2014. The training was attended by 30 (24 F & 6M) participants. The training was primarily intended to build the capacity of female MPs from Somali parliaments by equipping knowledge and skills in transformational leadership, advocacy, negotiation, conflict analysis and conflict resolution to enhance their active involvement in the Somali legislature and politics.

The Project is collaborating with UNFPA on the development of Sexual Offences laws for Somalia.

Partnerships with CSOs and government ministries towards promoting gender equality and women's empowerment continue to be strengthened. Alongside, various capacity development initiatives to strengthen these institutions were implemented such as capacity building training on gender mainstreaming for ministry staff and CSOs nationwide.

In the FGS, the project is collaborating with UNSOM, UNWomen and AMISOM in supporting the Ministry for Women, Human Rights and Development to develop a National Gender Policy for Somalia.

The Project continues to represent UNDP at the GTG and facilitate integration of gender into UNCT processes such as the ISF development and support to the Compact implementation. Project staff participated in the Gender Based violence working

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PEACE AND CONFLICT

No significant conflicts have been identified by the project during the reporting period.

The CCE-CC initiatives continue to sustain joint dialogue and reflection by communities on gender issues - which in the Somali context can be potentially volatile - with commendable success in reaching large numbers of community populations, male and female.

GENDER

The CO organized nation-wide gender training for all staff in June. This training meets current corporate requirement for all staff gender trainings every 2 years. It is styled as a refresher for programme staff and first-time/exploratory for operations and support staff. The aim of the training was to raise awareness of corporate gender policies and CO commitments and deepen staff knowledge on integrating gender into all CO programs and practices. Using a modular approach, the training covered: aligning CO programmes and operations to the Global Gender Strategy, the CO Gender Seal Action Plan, gender in project design and negotiations, integrating gender into security, HR management, procurement and communications. Action plans to implement the outcomes of the training in all regions are underway.

The training could not reach staff in Mogadishu due to security concerns

UPCOMING QUARTER

- a) FGM prevalence study and Post-election study on women's participation in the district council elections will be validated and disseminated.
- b) Support implementation of quota advocacy on women's political participation through an agreement with NAGAAD and MOLSA.
- c) Sensitizing male and female youth on prevention of GBV and behavioral change
- d) Counseling services provided to scholarship beneficiaries and other students and counseling training for MOE and FAWESOM staff
- e) CCE sessions will be continued throughout the year.
- f) The refresher CCE-CC training is planned in Q3 of this year as well as training of media professionals.
- g) Exchange programme for Justice sector actors on mainstreaming gender and human rights into the justice and security sector interventions

REFLECTIONS / LESSONS

Capacity challenges with Project counterparts remains a challenge necessitating mainstreaming of capacity building support into all project initiatives.

Political will to ensure commitments to gender equality are translated into sustainable policies and programmes on the ground remains weak. To address this the project continues to support sustained advocacy at the highest decision-making levels.

Regarding the quota proposal, a concern on the possibility of losing on time was raised during review meeting, and requested for urgent attention on the advocacy activities, to align and benefit from the presidential and parliamentary elections, that will be taking place in 2015. It was also emphasized the need for concerted efforts in pushing the quota bill.

Community Capacity Enhancement-Community Conversation (CCE-CC)

The social and cultural barriers remain a major obstacle to the advocacy efforts on women's rights and gender equality. Community conversation has been so far well appreciated by the communities in which it is implemented. It has been recognized for providing a platform for people to discuss sensitive issues such gender, creates a safe space for people to think through different perspectives relating to gender equality and come up with their own solutions to challenges.
