CONTEXTUAL ANALYSIS

FEDERAL LEVEL

In the final quarter of 2012, cabinet members were appointed and approved by the parliament. This included women – Fauzia Aden was appointed Deputy Prime Minister/Minister of Foreign Affairs, and Mariam Qasim was appointed Minister of Human Development and Public Services.

PUNTLAND

In Puntland, the President announced the creation of new political party, followed by an official launching. Other groups are also creating political groups, in preparation of elections which are scheduled for January, 2014. The President's mandate has been extended by the Constitution for one more year, however, this is still subject to approval by Elders. There are ongoing efforts by women's groups and activists to create a women's party, though nothing has been officially announced.

MOWDAFA's new Minister has assumed office. Halima Hassan took up her duties in later October, and has since been meeting with women's groups and agencies. The Gender Policy has still not been passed, with resistance felt from religious leaders and parliamentarians.

SOMALII AND

As planned, the elections of local councils were held on 28 November 2012. Seven political parties/associations took part in the first poll for local councils since 2002. This election saw the largest number of women candidates, around 172 women candidates, run for local councils of different districts. Preliminary figures indicate that only 10 women were elected, compared to 2 women councillors before the election.

ACTIVITY HIGHLIGHTS

FEDERAL LEVEL

The Gender Unit has completed the selection process for Micro-Capital Grants, and has supported one CSO working in Adaado. The organization will be mentoring young women to take up leadership positions, and undertaking community awareness and civic education on gender.

PUNTLAND

The Gender Unit has laid the groundwork for a number of initiatives which will be fully developed in 2013. This has included a training/workshop with 30 women district councillors from across the state, a consultation with journalists on gender sensitive reporting and the signing of MCGs with CSOs to carry out community initiatives on issues ranging from SGBV, FGM, etc.

SOMALILAND

Support for women's participation in the local elections was supported by UNDP through a local network of women's CSOs, and through media campaigning, sensitization with elders and traditional leaders, political parties and district councillors resulted in over 170 women running as candidates, though the number of women elected was significantly lower (preliminary results show only 10).

PARTNERSHIPS

In both Puntland and Somaliland, MOE collaboration on the implementation and management of scholarships is on-going. Partnerships with MOWDAFA in Puntland and MOLSA in Somaliland are on-going through LOAs.

In Puntland, the project has identified the focal point at MOWDAFA, and regularly meets with MOWDAFA staff for updates and technical advice on activities under the work plan. The project also collaborated with the HIV/AIDS Unit to undertake a joint mission to follow up on the Leadership Training.

In Somaliland, the project worked with with the A2J project on MCGs being given to one CSO, in order to avoid overlap and identify areas of collaboration. The LOA with MOLSA is being carried out in collaboration with PREP to coordinate relevant activities. For SC, the project is coordinating closely with UNPOS and UNWomen in preparation of a workshop for women parliamentarians in Mogadishu, scheduled for 2013. Within UNDP, the project is also working with the former Joint Constitution Unit and the Parliamentary Project to identify coming areas of support.

The Project participated in coordination meetings at the UNCT level to ensure synergies with gender related activities in other agencies and regularly attended meetings in the Gender Theme Group (GTG), the GBV work group and the task force on FGM. In cooperation with JCU, UNPOS and UNWomen, the project planned a conference and awareness campaign to support gender-sensitive implementation of the provisional constitution

PEACE AND CONFLICT

The project's interactions with partners and stakeholders continue to reveal that discussions on gender equality issues in the Somali context remain very sensitive. CEDAW is to date not ratified and very minimal recognition is given to international treaties promoting women's rights and gender equality. To avoid potential conflicts in this area, the project focuses on using gender equity and women's empowerment as entry points for engagement. The project also relies on the expertise of male Islamic scholars and Somali women's rights advocates to share and use their knowledge of women's rights in Islam to stimulate debate during project events.

GENDER

While majority of the project's outputs target women and girls as the main beneficiaries and change drivers, men have also been involved where necessary. For example, the leadership trainings recorded about 50% male participation and about 40% project managers of the CSO grant beneficiaries are male. As the public/civil service population remains overwhelmingly male, the project's main counterparts even within the national Gender Machinery are mostly male. Our continued interaction and dialogue with these male counterparts in project implementation deepens their conviction on women's rights and their capacity to act as gender champions.

The Gender Unit continued to provide gender mainstreaming support to other CO projects. In October, the Project facilitated a Gender Mainstreaming training for all Project staff in all the regions. The project also gave gender-related input to the Strategic Review and contributed to the Secretary Generals report on Conflict Related Sexual Violence.

UPCOMING QUARTER

The Gender Unit plans to hold consultations with the Minister of Human Development Public Services in Mogadishu, and a joint project has been planned with UNPOS and UNWomen to support gender-sensitive implementation of the new provisional federal constitution, including a conference for women parliamentarians and other stakeholders to provide a common platform for addressing gender issues, as well as public awareness of women's rights in the constitution and technical support to parliamentarians for promoting gender-sensitive legislation. In Puntland, CSOs will begin implementing activities under their MCG agreements. Work with MOWDAFA on the Gender Policy will focus on targeted advocacy, and their strategic plan will also be reviewed.

In Somaliland, HAVOYOCO and NAGAAD will commence the implementation of the new MCGs. MOLSA will undertake development of gender policy action plan, build the capacity of inter-ministerial gender focal points and establish inter-agency coordination.

REFLECTIONS / LESSONS

Work with CSOs has continued to prove challenging, as capacities are low. Training on grant management as well as financial and narrative reporting was delivered to four of the five grantees, but it is clear that further support will be required. Regular communication and monitoring missions are expected to help with this.

The annual work planning sessions with partners in Puntland and Somaliland were crucial in identifying priorities for 2013. In Puntland, given the change in minister, it is still clear that regular communication and follow up are required to ensure that the activities under the LOA are implemented.

Delivery for 2012 is at 64% due to the fact that the Gender Unit was only fully established at the end of the 3rd quarter when recruitment was completed. Now that the Gender Unit is fully staffed, work has accelerated. The 2012 Reflection and Planning Meeting, attended by all staff, except for the Somaliland National Gender Programme Officer, identified the need for clarification on communication flows, which will be followed up in 2013.
