CONTEXTUAL ANALYSIS

FEDERAL LEVEL

The federal parliament approved a cabinet of 10 ministers. The new Government intend to exercise its authority to all newly recovered areas. For this purpose, several ministerial missions were conducted in Baidoa, Beltweyne & lastly to Kismayu. Large scale reconstruction and renovations are taking place in Mogadishu and new businesses are emerging in residential sector, including revival of the beaches of Lido & Jazeera. Also it is noticed that large number of Diaspora is investing in Mogadishu - particularly in residential sector. The government removed illegal checkpoints in the city. This is has enhanced confidence among businesses. Moreover, the third generation internet service has been launched in Southern Somalia which will improve communications. UNDP is working closely with its implementation partners to seize this opportunity and provide catalytic support for local economic development.

PUNTLAND

Puntland Electoral Commission has enlisted several political parties verifying these as registered political Parties. The government has announced multi-party election in 2014. These elections will help in legitimizing local authorities and enhancing economy. Government forces have compelled pirates to flee the town. On Dec. 10th, forces attacked MV Iceberg, a hijacked vessel, and liberated its 22 hostages. Since Gara'ad is one of the targeted areas of UNDP's initiative to provide alternative livelihoods for anti-piracy, the project will rehabilitate the road connecting Gara'ad to Galkayo in order to improve security and livelihood of piracy-affected communities. On 24 December 2012, hundreds of demonstrators filled the streets of Galkayo to protest the extension of President's term by one year and the recent arrest of elders gathering in Garowe on the charge of attempting to create chaos. These tensions may have a negative impact on local economy and projects implementation.

SOMALII AND

The local councils elections were held peacefully in the majority of districts across Somaliland. The local municipal elections and emerging political parties strengthen the democratic process and pave the ground for sustainable development at the local level. The Elections bring a new change of leadership in the majority of the districts which led to change in the governors across all regions. The elections had noticeable effects on local economy. Certain businesses such as Kath trade, restaurants & hotels, media & printing agencies and transport are benefited from the elections campaign period.

The Local Economic Development (LED) project will engage with the new elected representative and support the economic activities for their constituents. Parliament passed the budget for 2013, which is estimated to be \$125 M. This budget is 17% higher than the budget of 2012. This also indicates government's intent to focus on immediate development needs of the citizens.

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ACTIVITY HIGHLIGHTS

FEDERAL LEVEL

Rehabilitation of two non-functional schools in Mogadishu (Hasan Qaridi School in Howlwadaag district and Mahmoud Warseme school in Heliwaa district) was completed. The enrolment Hasan Qaridi School is 458 and another 500 children are attending Mahmoud Warseme School. The local community is extremely pleased with having access to functional schools for their children.

PUNTLAND

In partnership with UNDP HIV/AIDS project, two initiatives are underway to build the capacities of persons living with HIV/AIDS. One initiative targeted 60 persons in Garowe while the other another 60 in Bosaso district. The activities under these initiatives consist of four components: human rights awareness; business training; provision of micro grants and follow-up on adoption of businesses.

SOMALILAND

The project completed its contribution to the activities for the rehabilitation of Burao Airport under cash-for-work scheme.

The skills training of 200 people in Burao Technical Institute was delayed. This was because of the limited capacity of the Ministry of Education. Time bound targets have been agreed with the Ministry to start and complete the training during first half of 2013.

PARTNERSHIPS

The project has synergies and close cooperation with other programmes in UNDP. During the quarter, in close cooperation with HIV/AIDS project, the Request for Proposals (RFPs) was announced in the three zones of Somalia (SL, PL and SC) for building the capacities and social integration of Persons Living with HIV/AIDS (PLWHIV/AIDS). As a result, the two initiatives went into implementation in Puntland to build the capacity of 120 PLWHIV/AIDS.

The project provided technical assistance to JPLG programme in Adado through initiation of RFP, review the received proposal, contracting the selected NGO and monitor the implementation of the project.

Also during the quarter, conducted several meetings with partner donors (Japan, Norway, and Italy) and UN agencies (WHO, ILO, UNICEF, UN-OCHA, UNHCR, IOM) to update them on progress and to discuss further cooperation.



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PEACE AND CONFLICT

In partnership with the Ministry of Youth, Labor and Sport in Puntland, the Garowe Municipality and the Somali National Olympic Committee, the project initiated rehabilitation of the municipal playground in Garowe. The proposed activities are to build a surrounding wall around the playground and to operationalise a multipurpose playground. The main purpose of the surrounding wall is to protect the land from the encroachers.

Few people claimed that the ownership of the land and prevented the contractor to start the work. Two men came with guns and forced the contractor to leave the site. The project management decided to freeze the work until the Government resolve the issue or come up with the alternative site that has clear ownership rights with the government is identified.

GENDER

Gender mainstreaming and segregation of beneficiaries by gender is integral part of the project. This is reflected in the PREP database, which is an open repository accessible on internet.

To enhance the capacity of the project staff to mainstream gender in their interventions and reporting, all the staff in three Somali zones and in Nairobi attended the Gender training conducted by the Gender Unit during the Quarter. We can expect that the staff are in better understanding of gender after the training and their monitoring and reporting capacity on the component is improved.

The project kept the policy of maintaining at least 30% of beneficiaries from short term employment to be women. The target has, however, been overachieved as the number of benificiaries surpass the 30%.

UPCOMING QUARTER

The Local Economic Development (LED) project has conducted meetings with the relevant stakeholder including government counterparts and partner NGOs in Somaliland and Puntland to detail out the annual work plan for 2013. Similar meetings will be conducted with the Federal Government in January 2013.

Also the project as part of PREP has conducted meetings with several traditional donors of PREP/LED to update the donors on the achieved progress in 2012 and as efforts of fund raising for 2013.

The project initiated evaluation of EGER and ABER projects. The evaluation report capturing the lessons and key recommendations will be shared by end-January 2013. A new project document will be formulated to scale up the activities and mobilise resources.



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REFLECTIONS / LESSONS

Assessing the capacities of the partners especially the government partners prior to signing of any agreement is essential. The capacity assessment should be comprehensive and cover all required dimensions including technical expertise, management capacity, financial management capacity, implementation monitoring capacity, physical assets available to the government institutions to handle the project, number and qualification of staff suggested to work on the project etc. etc. The purpose of the assessment should be to facilitate the government institutions to enhance their capacities.

In Somaliland, short-term employment is not a priority for the Government. So, short-term employment should not be considered as a result at its own. It could be a side product of infrastructure rehabilitation that leads to employment creation over short-term.

Positive impact on people lives and change is much more obvious when interventions are undertaken in remote areas with communities that have limited or no access to productive assets. Therefore, the focus of Local Economic Development (LED) project during 2013 is to extend the outreach to remote areas that have been neglected in the past by UNDP and other actors.
