CONTEXTUAL ANALYSIS

FEDERAL LEVEL

UNDP works closely with South Central AIDS Commission (SCAC) at the federal level in Mogadishu to help create a more supportive environment for all HIV activities in Somalia. As the current HIV strategy for Somalia will come to an end on 31st December 2013, a key priority for the remainder of the 2013 will be developing a new HIV strategy for Somalia that is costed from 2014-2018. The importance of the development of the a new strategy cannot be over emphasized as it is a requirement for Somalia to submit with the next HIV proposal to the Global Fund, due in early 2014. The Global Fund currently provides approximately 95% of all funding for HIV work in Somalia. UNDP is working closely with UNAIDS who will take the lead to develop this new strategy and have brought on board KPMG who will take the lead in providing technical expertise and costing this new strategy.

PUNTLAND

UNDP's relationship with Puntland AIDS Commission (PAC) improved over the last quarter as the Commission paid back some funds owed to UNDP. Nevertheless the capacity of the AIDS Commission remains weak, with staff that have very little technical expertise. The delays in the disbursement of funds from the Global Fund which were only released in September 2013 (for the year Jan - December 2013) did not help, as it meant that staff working with the AIDS Commission did not receive incentives paid by the Global Fund for the first 8 months of the year. However as the Principal Recipient (PR) for the Global Fund grant in Somalia (UNICEF Somalia) has signed an agreement for 2014 with the GF we are hopeful that the same delays will not occur in 2014. UNDP the three AIDS Commissions and other CSP Stakeholders had a meeting with the PR and the Global Fund in Uganda in Q3 to discuss various issues which was helpful.

SOMALILAND

A new Executive Director was appointed for Somaliland National AIDS Commission (SOLNAC) in the last quarter. Despite the change, day to day activities of the National AIDS Commission continued over the last quarter. The new ED also arranged for the President of Somaliland Mr. Silanyo, as Chairman of the AIDS Commission to visit SOLNAC offices soon after his appointment. In a press release the President expressed deep concerns that funding for HIV and AIDS responses is not commensurate with the magnitude of the epidemic due to the global financial & economic crisis, and said that the Somaliland government would try to mobilize more resources locally. The President also highlighted the need to build political support for HIV and AIDS programmes at district & regional level. Noting that the HIV Strategy for Somalia will come to an end in December 2013, UNDP is working with SOLNAC and UNAIDS to develop a new HIV Strategy to guide the response from 2014-2018

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ACTIVITY HIGHLIGHTS

FEDERAL LEVEL

Noting the success of Community Conversations on HIV in Somaliland and Puntland, UNDP have identified two suitable locations to introduce Community Conversations on HIV in Banadir and Gedo regions of the federal level. UNDP have also selected two NGOs to work with on this project and provided training to the local facilitators and Recource people such as Religious Leaders that will be expected to take the lead in implementing this project. This will help scale up community outreach work linked to HIV in South Central which to date has been limited due to security concerns.

Secondly, UNDP in collaboration with UNAIDS have brought on board KPMG in Q3 to help develop a new costed HIV Strategy for Somalia 2014-2018 in O4 of 2013.

PUNTLAND

UNDP have signed partnership agreements with 2 NGOs in Puntland that will continue to roll out Community Conversations on HIV in Bosaso and Garowe now that funds from the Global Fund have been received.

SOMALILAND

Community Conversations on HIV have proven to be useful in reaching women, men and youth that would usually not be reached by more formal HIV Workshops. In areas where Community Conversations on HIV are being delivered it would appear that some transformational behavior changes have been observed, which include communities becoming more accepting of People Living with HIV (PLHIV) in their communities and more people accessing VCT services in areas where community conversations are being rolled out. These are both significant achievements.

PARTNERSHIPS

At the federal level UNDP continues to work closely with the AIDS commission to help them better coordinate and support all HIV stakeholders in the Somalia. UNDP also continues to work closely with UNICEF, UNAIDS and others UN agencies that are part of the UN Joint Team on AIDS. In addition UNDP works with AAWDO and HDC two local NGOs to support the rights of People living with HIV & AIDS and will soon start to work with these NGOs to help carry out more HIV outreach work, through a project known as Community Conversations on HIV in Banadir and Gedo region in Q4

In Somaliland the HIV unit will start a new partnership with TALOWADAG Network for PLHIV, to start rolling out Community Conversations on HIV in two new sites in Borama and Hargeisa in Q4. SOLNAC continues to be the primary government institution that UNDP works with in Somalialnad to coordinate HIV interventions in the region. The HIV Unit also continues to work with YOVENCO, a strong parnter in Berbera that support CC's on HIV in 5 villages each month.

In Puntland UNDP's main government partner is Puntland AIDS Commission (PAC). NGO partners include BADBAADO based in Bosaso and TASS in Garowe. In collaboration with UNDP PREP programme the HIV programme has also worked with an NGO called TIDES to support an Income Generating Project (IGA) for PLHIV. In Quarter 4 UNDP plans to form stronger partnerships with the most popular radio stations in Puntland in collaboration with Puntland AIDS Commission (PAC).

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PEACE AND CONFLICT

There continues to be a misunderstanding about the different role of the Ministry of Health and the AIDS Commission in the response to HIV and AIDS in Somalia, which has led to tension between the two government institutions. UNAIDS in collaboration with UNDP did make a presentation on this issue at the Health Sector Meeting in December 2012, however it appears that the confusion about their different roles and responsibilities is still not clear to all partners. It is likely this has resulted due to competition for resources. To this end this will be a critical issue that will need to be discussed and agreed upon during the development of the new HIV strategy for Somalia 2014-2018. The work of the Ministry of Health is critical in addressing all medical components of the HIV response, as is the role of the AIDS Commission in relation to strengthening the multi-sectoral response to HIV. It is therefore important to strengthen relationships and linkages between these two institutions.

GENDER

The incidence and prevalence of HIV & AIDS cannot be separated from social norms and cultural structures that are closely associated with gender issues in Somalia. The HIV Programme therefore continues to work in close partnership with the Gender Programme at UNDP Somalia, particularly in the area of community outreach activities such as Community Conversations on HIV, to ensure that gender issues are adequately addressed in our work. In this regard the HIV programme includes specific sessions to discuss and address gender issues during Community Conversations on HIV. In certain cases specific sessions on HIV are also supported for young men and women. UNDP also continues to support Networks of People Living with HIV in Somalia whose main members are women. In Q4 UNDP will assist UNAIDS in undertaking a gender assessment to see how all partners in Somalia can better address gender issues closely linked to HIV in their work.

UPCOMING QUARTER

Below are the main activities that will be carried out and supported in Q4 (October - December 2013):

- 1. Finalise contract with KPMG who will take the lead to develop a new costed HIV Strategy for Somalia 2014-2018.
- 2. Support the 3 AIDS Commissions to hire National Consultants to work with KPMG and the lead consultant to develop the new costed HIV strategy for Somalia 2014-2018.
- 2.Support 3 zonal consultation meetings on the draft of the new HIV strategy for Somalia 2014-2018, to ensure that all HIV stakeholders have the opportunity to participate in the development of this new strategy.
- 3. Support the roll out of the Community Conversation on HIV in Somaliland and Puntland as well as in two new regions (Banadir and Gedo regions) in South and Central Somalia.
- 4.Support each AIDS Commission to prepare for World AIDS Day (WAD) on 1st December 2013.
- 5.Support Somali representatives to participate in International Conference on AIDS in Africa (ICASA) in South Africa December 2013

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REFLECTIONS / LESSONS

- 1. There has been an increased level of awareness and positive trends in behavioral change towards people living with HIV (PLHIV). This demonstrates some level of reduction in the negative thinking towards PLHIV as communities gain accurate information on correct mode of HIV transmission.
- 2. As communities gain information on HIV prevention and available services such as Voluntary Counselling and Testing (VCT), there has been an increase in the number of people seeking VCT services to know their HIV status in areas where Community Conversations are being supported.
- 3. Community Conversations are also becoming a platform for communities to discuss other hot issues such as maternal health and nutrition.
- 4. Positive results have been achieved by hosting discussions in the open (outside) on issues to do with morality in the presence of Religious Leaders and Community Elders. For example, Community Conversations on HIV have provided a forum to discuss sensitive issues such as the use of condoms. By highlighting the important role condoms can play as an HIV preventative method which include protecting people whose partners are HIV+ communities are gradually becoming more sensitised about the important role condoms can play in reducing new HIV infections.
- 5. HIV Radio Project: Working in collaboration with radio stations in Somalia can help reach substantially more people with HIV prevention, care and treatment messages. In South and Central Somalia where there are many regions that have received very little HIV sensitisation this has been recommended as one way of reaching out to more people.
