### 9. Brief summary of the mission

- Upon arrival in Paramaribo on Monday evening, an informal debriefing session was held with SBB (upon their request), to discuss how the first day of presentations went with ANRICA;
- Tuesday consisted of the second day meeting between ANRICA and SBB on the pre-NFI project, discussions on the way forward and technical questions raised;
- Wednesday morning: working session with SBB on technical questions;
- Wednesday afternoon: meeting with NIMOS and UNDP country offices to discuss technical activities under Pillar 3, inception workshop and set up / recruitment of PMU, followed by a debriefing with the UNDP country office.
- Thursday morning: working session with SBB on specific activities under Pillar 3, priorities and concrete steps forward;
- Thursday lunch-time: Debrief with UNDP country office.
- Thursday evening: departure

#### 9.a Findings

- ANRICA SBB meeting:
  - SBB did not feel confident on the results presented by ANRICA and had many technical concerns;
  - ANRICA was trying to push SBB into signing an agreement to continue the full NFI development with them, while not having completed the pre-NFI project yet. ANRICA is a commercial company, trying to sell its technology and methodology to combine aerial photography and field measurements to conduct an NFI. The software is non-open source (privately owned), including sophisticated analyses which Suriname is not able (and unlikely that it will in the future) to conduct within the country;
  - The initial report provided by ANRICA was sub-standard, creating issues of distrust with SBB;
  - The meeting concluded on a positive note, where SBB was able to communicate what it wanted to see better explained in the report of the pre-NFI. No commitments were made by SBB on how to continue after the completion of the pre-NFI project
- Prodoc implementation Pillar 3
  - SBB appears to be ready to start a work plan, capacity assessment and drafting of ToRs to implement Pillar

 NIMOS does not seem to have the capacity or have given much thought on how to start implementing Pillar 3.

## 9.b Results achieved (key outputs)

- Supported SBB in the technical discussions with ANRICA
- Discussed a concrete forward with SBB to start implementing the activities for which they are responsible under Pillar 3:
- Provided technical information on Brazil's reference level;
- Briefly presented and demonstrated CollectEarth for Suriname in light of its land-use change assessment
- Presented the OpenForis suite for SBB to look at and evaluate if any of the tools could be useful for their NFI;
- Shared a presentation on NFMS for REDD+ under the UNFCCC that I gave in Bhutan so that SBB can familiarise itself with the process;
- Preliminary discussion with NIMOS on how they are thinking of implementing the activities for which they are responsible in Pillar 3.

# 9.c Expected outcomes and impacts

- SBB will send us a list of bullet points to include in the ToRs for activity 3b3
- SBB to conduct a capacity assessment in terms of HR, expertise and hardware to execute the activities for Pillar 3
- SBB to review its work plan based on point 2 above.
- SBB to indicate focal point for communication with SBB and UNDP on Pillar 3
- Follow up technical discussions with SBB
