1. Background to the Sustainable Development Goals Fund

The Joint Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) Fund is an innovative instrument, integrated into the UN reform, with specific objective to providing the RC and UNCT a mechanism to collaborate together with national governments towards accelerated realization of the 17 Sustainable Development Goals.

The Joint SDG Fund is a multi-partner trust fund. To date it has funded 97 joint programmes focused on integrated social protection or SDG finance. The joint SDG fund focus is to leave no one behind and this through shift from traditional development approach towards more inclusive and more market based and innovative financing from domestic as well as international financing sources.

From the SDG fund secretariat website we note that the special nature of the fund is derived from the objective of supporting integral and holistic policies and strategies towards realizing the SDGs. These are socially, economically and environmentally integrated and holistic policies and strategies, including the financing of the implementation.

2. Summary of SDG Component 1 Launch

2.1. Goals and objective launch

This high-level launch event aimed to:

1. Bringing visibility and call to action to the realization of the 17 Sustainable Development Goals.
2. Present the key components of the Suriname Joint SDG programme component 1.
3. Share background information on the journey of identification, formulation and review undertaken to arrive at this point of having the Joint programme launched today.
4. The governance structure for implementation, milestones and results in moving forward.

This high-level launch event as mandated by the signed programme document, also poses an opportunity to engage and seek input from you stakeholder, beneficiaries and implementing partners towards enhancing results from the Joint Programme.

2.2. High level messages

The UN Resident Coordinator Ms. Marina Walters in her video statement shared the following.

1. If we are to build back better after COVID-19 we need to get the right economic social and environmental policies in place and mobilize the financing required to bring them to scale as quickly as possible. The joint SDG fund is an innovative instrument to support Suriname on this path and a critical component of the UN's development response to accelerate the SDG implementation.
2. The United Nations country team is committed to supporting to accompanying and pioneering new ways of addressing the environmental challenges that face the country together with you we need to do it together in an alliance of government and your civil society and the private sector.
3. Now it is time for bold leadership on climate action, both individual and collective. This child program is not meant to solve all our climate related problems overnight, but it is a springboard to effectively develop Suriname's capacities in this area of integrated climate financing and environmentally based solutions
4. "The road map for sustainable financial system in Suriname" project allows the country to build an integrated national financing framework aimed at strengthening capacities at the national level and nurturing dialogues and solutions that involve the private financial and the public sector through the holistic national financing architecture that will aim at leveraging nature-based solutions.
5. The font works in two important ways. First it strengthens and expand social protection reaching the most vulnerable and marginalized so that we leave no one behind. But it also works together to build national strategies to catalyze investments to leverage public and private financing.

The Honorable Minister Albert Ramdin of the “Ministerie van Buitenlandse zaken, International Business en Internationale Samenwerking suriname (BIBIS)” commemorated in his video remark

1. Appreciation for the joint government of Suriname and UN team efforts resulting in successful accession of funds and launch event today.
2. That the genesis of this SDG Joint Fund is at reaching the most vulnerable and marginalized that are often not reached.
3. That arriving at a roadmap for a sustainable financing system for SDG through leveraging of nature-based solutions aligns to the objective of newly elected government under leadership of the president of Suriname, his excellency Chandrikapersad Santokhi.
4. As part of the crisis management and economic recovery as foreseen in the annual development plan, that is inclusive of diversification, financial recovery also states government commitment towards the realization of the sustainable development goals aimed at a more just, fair and equal society.

The Honorable Minister Silvano Tjong-Ahin in his remarks highlighted that:

1. The realization of the SDGs agreed five years ago is under pressure in light of socio-economic challenges Suriname faces whereby financial flows are being redirected towards urgent and immediate response towards socio-economic challenges exacerbated by COVID-19.
2. SDG joint programme is therefore timely in supporting Suriname in establishing baseline in SDG progress as well as formulation of response in the realization of the SDG, within the context of Suriname national development plan comes at a critical time when Suriname is designing short-term and medium terms response to challenges it faces.
3. Suriname affirmed its commitment to sound custodianship of its natural resources at international fora such as COP24 with 93% forest cover commitment, that was reaffirmed at COP25 with the submission of Suriname second Nationally Determined Contribution. The passing of the Environmental Framework Law establishing the National Environmental Management Agency (NMA) and repositioning of the Ministry of Spatial Planning and Environment.

4. Inclusivity in development of response and maintaining environmental commitments given Environment is anybody and everybody business. Especially the less privileged and business community are of specific focus.

5. Suriname is most appreciative of the recognition and financial support to conservation to date however it should not remain at honorary recognition and shining reports of the work Suriname is doing but go beyond to substantive financial and development support to the realization of the Sustainable development goals, bringing benefits to the less privileged.

2.3. Suriname Component 1 presentation key messages

1. To support the 2030 Agenda - specifically SDG Acceleration - based on national leadership, innovation, integrated approach, and partnerships
2. Joint Programme Approach
3. Project duration 24 months start date 1st October 2020 and end date 30 Sept 2022
4. 3 phases of Diagnostic, Capacity building and engagement, development of Green agreement
5. Holistic, integrated based on national development plans, with focus on the Banking and Finance sector, linked to productive sectors of Artisanal and Small-Scale Mining and Forestry.

2.4. Closing Remarks UN partner agencies

Highlights remarks UNFPA Liaison Officer Ms. Judith Brielle:

1. UNFPA will contribute to this project by looking at the gender aspects. We are not going to do this alone, at this moment work was done in cooperation with the Gender Bureau of the Ministry of Home Affairs and input was also received from the Institute for Women Gender and Development studies.
2. There are 2 specific deliverables within the project that UNFPA is directly responsible for “: the gender analysis and the gender policies and procedures”.
3. If we are to reach the SDGs we must ensure that all get the opportunity to contribute to the dialogues. So yes, that may mean given more females a place at the table.
4. But we want to engage all so feel free to also engage us as we are available and willing to work with you

Highlights remarks Mr. Reuben Robertson, FAO Representative to Trinidad and Tobago and Suriname

1. Our theme for World Food Day is, “Grow, Nourish, Sustain. Together: Our Action is Our Future”.
2. It is within this context that FAO gives its commitment to work with the Government and people of Suriname for achieving the Sustainable Development Goals.
3. FAO will assist in developing a Financing Mechanism using a Value Chain approach.
4. FAO will use its technical assistance to create Platforms for dialogue and engagement of stakeholders, including donors to design and develop the financing model for forestry in Suriname.

Highlights remarks Vincent Sweeney, Head, Caribbean Sub Regional Office, UNEP


1. The Decade of Action calls for transformative environmental, social, and economic solutions to accelerate delivery on the SDGs. This Joint Fund promises that for Suriname.
1. The interconnected nature of the Joint Fund is not only reflected in the wide range of SDGs it targets but also in the scope of stakeholders whose support and expertise has been and will continue to be vital in developing and implementing this project.
2. Governments play an integral leadership role in establishing and enforcing long-term priorities and values, as well as facilitating alliances and partnerships through their interaction with other economic and private sectors.
3. We are also delighted to have the private sector, civil society, academia and other stakeholders serve as integral parts to the implementation of the Joint Programme.

Highlights remarks Dr. Margaret Jones Williams Deputy Resident Representative United Nations Development Programme.

1. The SDGs – the Sustainable Development Goals – and the 2030 Agenda has only 10 years left for us to achieve the ambitious 17 goals and 169 targets.
2. Suriname has submitted its Second Nationally Determined Contribution (NDC) which outlines the plans for reducing green-house gas emissions and adaptation for low lying coastal areas, and other vulnerable areas.
3. We will build on the success of the Global Climate Change Alliance Project (GCCA) and the EnGenDER Project which look at integrating gender considerations, environment and disaster risk reduction.
4. All persons including indigenous and tribal people, persons with disabilities and ensuring gender integration, supporting the whole of society approach and inclusivity and in this way ensuring we Leave No One Behind.
