



ACCESS to JUSTICE

Access to Justice portfolio provides support to the justice and security sectors with a heightened focus on gender justice. The areas of work include i) enhancing access to justice of women GBV survivors (strengthened access to legal information and the quality of legal aid services), ii) strengthening gender-responsiveness in the sector (survivor-centered and responsive criminal justice processes, increase of women's representation in the legal profession), and iii) correctional facilities in line with the human rights standards and female inmates' special needs.

Development Challenges

-  Gender-based violence is a prevalent issue: 36% of women experience physical partner violence, 31% of whom experienced sexual violence.
-  Gender disparity in the justice sector: 23% of accredited legal professionals in Timor-Leste are women
-  Male & female prisoners share the same facilities which against Rule 11 of UN Standard Minimum Rules for the Treatment of Prisoners
-  Lack of access to justice: female pre-trial detainees rarely have access to counsel

What we have achieved

- 149 law graduates** (52% women, 17% from remote areas, 4% with disabilities) receiving online legal training to help their future legal career development
- 322 community members** (42% women) **participated in the three-day workshop** on the Formal Justice System, Gender Equality, and GBV as well as Community-Based Mediation
- 36 civil cases (35 land disputes)**, involving 76 disputants (38% women), **registered**; 14 land cases facilitated for mediation, involving 29 disputants (49% women)
- Over 70** magistrates and legal professionals, national police, and academia participated in the Ministry of Justice (MoJ) conference on Gender Equality
- Six law graduates** (2 women & 4 men) have been placed as interns in legal CSOs & assisting GBV survivors to access justice

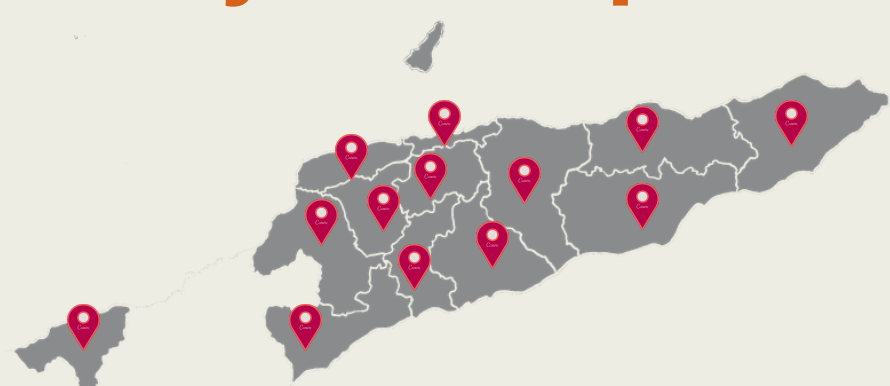
