#### Introduction

PREPARE, RESPOND, RECOVER: UNDP's integrated approach

UNDP's response is framed around three objectives: (a) help Yemen prepare for and protect people from the pandemic and its impacts; (b) respond during the outbreak; and, (c) recover from the economic and social impacts in the months to come.

## Prepare

UNDP is supporting Yemen to strengthen the health systems including by helping procure much-needed medical supplies, quickly leveraging digital technologies and ensuring health workers are paid.

## RESPOND

UNDP is working across key sectors to slow the spread of the virus and to provide social protection for vulnerable populations, promoting a whole-ofgovernment and whole-ofsociety response to complement efforts in the health sector.

### RECOVER

UNDP is supporting the assessment of social and economic impacts of COVID-19 and take urgent recovery measures to minimize longterm impact, particularly for vulnerable and marginalized groups, and to help Yemen recover.

## COVID-19 Community Outreach

- 69,000 community members; 47,300 female nutrition-related cash-transfer recipients; and, 6,251 cash-for-work employees reached during awareness raising (all governorates)
- Over 10,000 people reached with community radio awareness-raising public service announcements
- 7,500 masks and 160 protective gowns locally produced 5,000 COVID-19 awareness-raising posters printed and distributed to
- communities across Yemen
- 1,800 young females trained to raise COVID-19 awareness across Yemen 1,242 households received COVID-19 materials (Al-Shamteen, Taiz governorate)
- 450 people obtained awareness-raising sessions (Abyan governorate) 40 women trained to make homemade sanitizers across Yemen
- 10 COVID-19 community awareness-raising videos developed



### Micro and Small Business Support

- 53 micro-businesses established (including 37 for mask production and 16 for soap)
- Socio-economic impact assessment finished to identify and support microbusinesses affected by COVID-19 (Sarar district, Abyan governorate)
- Organized training of trainers to prepare small businesses in liquid soap production (Abyan, Hajjah, Hodeidah and Lahj governorates)
