

## Yemen Resilience Monitor: **Communities coping with Conflict** Impact of the War on Social Cohesion May 2016 Methodology Data was collected between Covering a sample of 1,152 families across August and September 2015 at six governorates. the household level. Yemen Resilience Monitor will measure social cohesion with the following indicators: (i) confidence in institutions, (ii) participation, (iii) tolerance, and (iv) solidarity. **Problems within the community** Yemen Resilience Monitor looked into challenges that communities are facing. interviewed in all six governorates raised unemployment and poverty as top two important problems. People's trust in formal institutions was particularly low except police and military while there are variations among governorates.
